Why is palliative care important?

76% patients had at least 1 acute admission in the last 12 months of life

48% patients had at least 1 acute admission in the last month of life

Just under 50% of patients die in their usual place of residence

‘Some people experience excellent care in hospitals; hospices; care homes and in their own homes. But the reality is that many do not’.

Up to 20% of patients die in hospital waiting for care

10% -16% of recorded inpatient deaths are those admitted from a care home

Average length of stay in hospital prior to death is 6-7 Days

Secured funding of £413k across Leicester, Leicestershire and Rutland

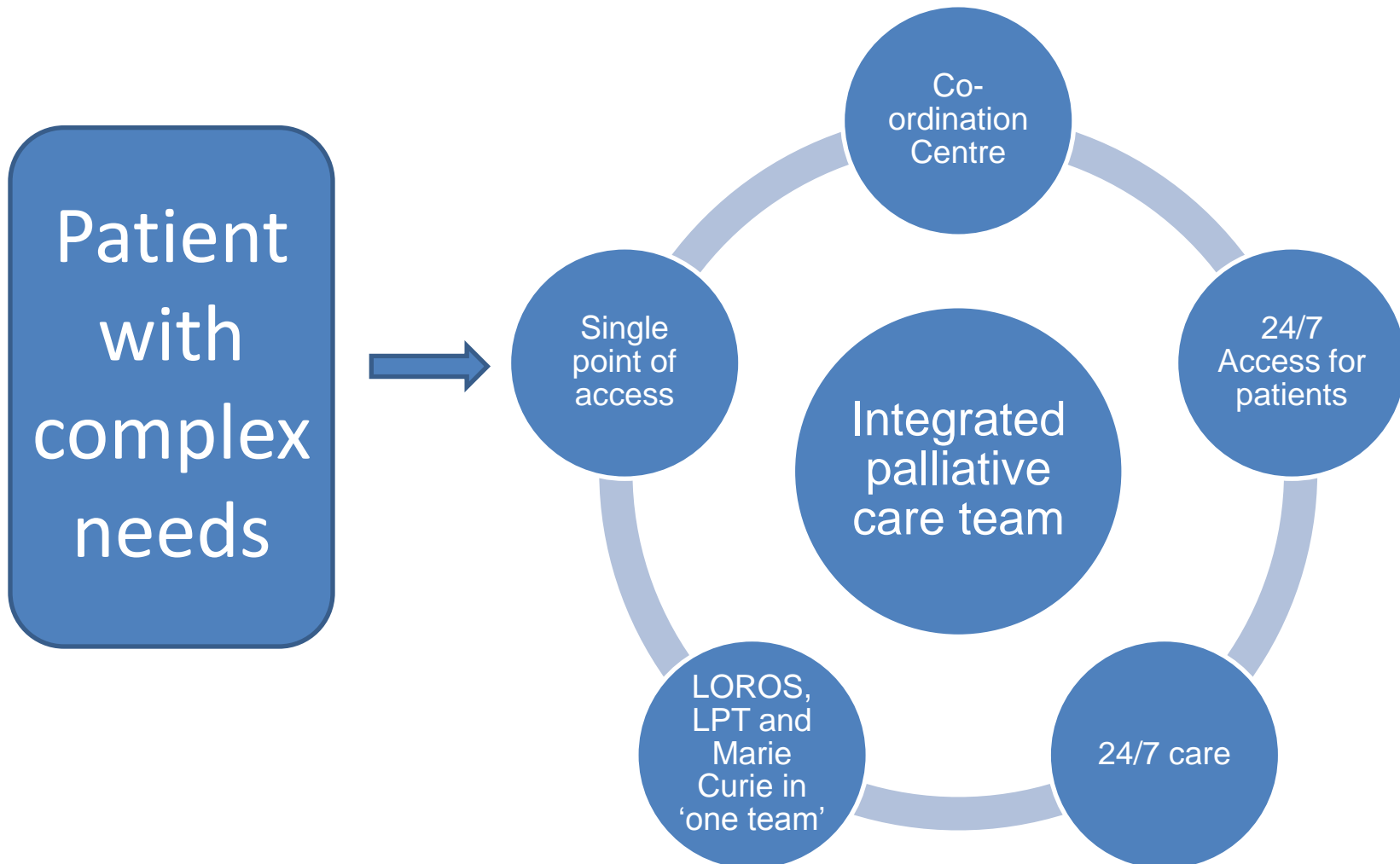
