Highlight Report from the Public Commissioning Collaborative Board (CCB) – May 2019

1. The purpose of this report is for Commissioning Collaborative Board (CCB) to provide the Governing Body with an update on decisions made and escalate risks and issues identified.
2. CCB is a joint committee of NHS East Leicestershire and Rutland CCG, NHS West Leicestershire CCG and NHS Leicester City CCG. CCB's role is to:
 - Support CCGs to create a financial sustainable health system in Leicester, Leicestershire and Rutland (LLR).
 - Ensure clinically led co-design of service models for health services within LLR are safe, effective and efficient.
 - Provide a forum where commissioners can agree and align priorities and identify opportunities for further collaboration and consistency.
 - Provide onward assurance to the respective Governing Bodies.
3. The key areas of discussion and outcomes from the May 2019 meeting are summarised below.
4. **Children and Young People's Mental Health Support Team:** Children and Young People's Mental Health Support Team: It was reported that in January 2019, the government published the NHS Long-term plan which re-confirmed the commitments from the 2017 children and young people's mental health green paper which set out proposals to improve mental health support in schools and college's. Over the next five years, the NHS will fund new mental health support teams (MHST) working in schools and colleges, building on the support already available. In 2018 a selection process identified the first 25 trailblazer sites nationally. Three Leicester, Leicestershire and Rutland (LLR) CCGs submitted a joint bid which was unsuccessful at that time.
5. CCB noted that in April 2019, the LLR CCG's were invited to apply for the Phase two Trailblazer bid with the aim to increase capacity and deliver a more efficient and effective emotional, mental health and wellbeing service in schools. The Trailblazer bid will focus on children and young people with ASD/Autism and behaviour that challenges and address the increasing need for neurodevelopmental interventions, support advice and training. This service will increase access to evidence based interventions for mild to moderate needs in schools.
6. The report detailed the number of schools that responded to the expression of interest to schools and education settings across LLR. A number of schools also attended the multiagency workshops. Based on the information provided in the report CCB noted that there was disparity on the number of schools in City and County and requested the offer to be made available across all schools including secondary schools.

7. It was reported that this was the first stage for ensuring that LLR CCGs are successful in securing the bid. Once the bid has been secured the projects will take place to fully operationalise within 12 months of the project initiation. Furthermore there will be rolled out across the City and County schools once the projects are implemented. CCB members supported the draft bid subject to some salient amendments prior to submission regarding the ongoing funding requirements.
8. **Update on the Commissioning Capability Programme (CCP):** The CCP provides tailored support to the Commissioners to deliver through place-based solutions and equip them with the skills to deliver on both the challenges of present and future. Through the programme NHS England supports commissioning systems to increase their capacity and capability. It was reported that a number of workshops have taken place which focused on the vital areas. It was informed that a piece of work will now be taken forward from the outputs of the workshops that will support the functions of the CCGs in becoming Strategic Commissioners.
9. CCB members welcomed the update and requested that regular updates are presented at CCB in order to ensure that the work undertaken does not steer away from the direction of travel.
